IMPORTANT UPDATE ON JAVA USAGE FOR GOVERNMENT APPLICATIONS

Dear Valued Client,

In light of recent changes to Oracle's Java licensing model, the Registry would like to provide an important update regarding the use of Java for accessing the *CORIS* application.

As part of the broader efforts to modernize and enhance the delivery of digital services, the Cayman Islands Government is actively working to transition client-facing applications to more secure and efficient platforms that do not rely on Java. This strategic initiative is aimed at improving system security, performance, and user experience.

Interim Java Usage and Licensing

To support continuity during this transition, the Government has procured an Oracle Java license which permits the use of Java for specific, approved applications. Clients accessing these applications may continue using the standard Java client under the terms of the Government's license agreement.

Approved Applications

Please note that Java usage under the Government's license is restricted to the CORIS application for the General Registry department.

Important Licensing Note

Any use of Java beyond these approved applications is **NOT** covered under the Government's license. Should your organization require Java for other purposes, a separate Oracle Java license must be obtained.
